
Focus Question #2:

What Is History?






History is...

- More than a series of dramatic events
- Story of the human community
 - How people lived on a daily basis
 - How they shared ideas
 - How they ruled and were ruled
 - How they fought
 - Story of dreams fulfilled or unfulfilled
 - Story of creativity
 - Story of Philosophical and religious inspiration



- Archaeology Study of early people by examining things they left behind
- Archaeologist Study artifacts such as tools, weapons, clothing, pottery
 - Learn about the beliefs and activities of a group of people



- Dating system most commonly used
 <u>based on</u> the assumed date of the birth of Jesus Christ
 - An event that took place 400 years before the birth of Christ would be dated 400 BC
 - -Dates after the birth of Christ are labeled AD for the Latin *anno Domini*, which means "in the year of the Lord", 250 AD or just 250

Time:

- Because AD and BC are so Western and Christian-oriented, historians now use:
 - -BCE "before the common era"
 - -CE "common era"


By the Numbers:


- Other terms used to refer to time:
 - -Decade = 10 years
 - Century = 100 years
 - Millennium = 1,000 years
 - -1st Century = years 1 to 100
 - -4th Century = years 301 to 400 (the fourth period since the birth of Christ)




By the Numbers:

- 401 to 500








